REPORTABLE DISEASES FOR SCHOOLS

The following diseases should be **REPORTED IMMEDIATELY** to the Communicable Disease Unit of the Oakland County Health Division during work hours at: 248-858-1286 or after hours at 248-858-0931 (ask for Health Administrator on Call)

- Hepatitis A
- Meningococcal Disease (meningitis or meningococemia)
- Pertussis (Whooping Cough)
- Rash Illnesses
- Rubella (German measles)
- Measles (Rubeola/hard measles)
- Tuberculosis

The following diseases are common reportable diseases or conditions which must be reported to Oakland County Health Division within 24 hrs.
