Police: Man tried to bite deputy after arrest

A 56-year-old man, who had been driving erratically in Highland Township, attempted to bite an Oakland County Sheriff's Office deputy after being arrested when he took a Breathalyzer test and it registered he had a .29% blood alcohol content, police said today.

According to the sheriff's office, the man — who police said eventually admitted that he is not a U. S. citizen — was stopped after police received a complaint at about 3 p.m. Wednesday that a silver Grand Marquis was "all over the road" in the area of N. Milford Road and Peninsula Lake. Police said that, after the vehicle was located, the man was given the Breathalyzer and was transported to Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital for a blood draw. At that time, the man started to resist, attempted to bite the deputy and then kicked him in the leg.

Police said the man had no Social Security number and was not able to produce documentation of citizenship. U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement was notified and placed a detainer on the man, according to the sheriff's office.
