



Highland teen crashes into deputy's car

Two deputies with the Oakland County Sheriff's Office were spared what could have been severe injuries New Year's Day when a 17-year-old Highland boy reportedly lost control of his vehicle and crashed into a parked patrol car as the deputies investigated another accident on Highland Road.

According to the OCSO, there was no one in the patrol car — which was in the median of Highland Road just west of Milford Road — when the teen's vehicle, heading eastbound on Highland Road, plowed into its side, a perpendicular hit commonly called "t-boning."

Reports state the teen was driving too fast for the weather conditions when he attempted to turn from eastbound Highland Road to northbound Milford Road when he lost control. The teenager, who was driving a 1996 Buick, was not injured in the crash either.

The incident occurred just west of Milford Road, shortly after 8 p.m.

The two deputies moved the damaged patrol vehicle to the Highland substation, and it was subsequently towed to the county's central garage. The teen was issued citations for hazardous action — fail

to use caution for stationary emergency responder, as well as for having no vehicle registration or proof of insurance.

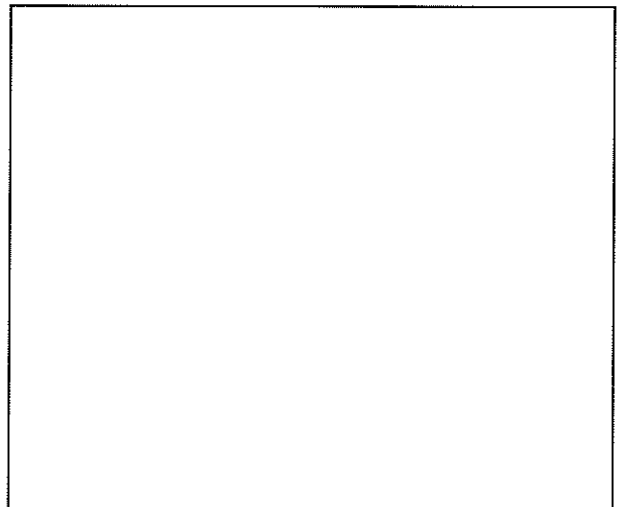
