South Lyon Area Cop Calls

Eluding police

A 17-year-old Grand Rapids woman was charged for fleeing and eluding and reckless driving after she was pulled over on I-96 Saturday night, and then led police on a high speed chase.

According to police reports, deputies from the Oakland County Sheriff's Office pulled the woman over around 9:30 p.m. after she was allegedly speeding on eastbound I-96 near Old Plank Road. As deputies walked up to her vehicle, she fled the scene at a high rate of speed. Deputies pursued the vehicle, but lost sight of it near Wixom Road. At that point the sergeant on command told the deputies to terminate the pursuit.

Deputies spotted the vehicle a short time later traveling northbound on Milford Road. Deputies activated their overhead lights again and stopped the vehicle at a gas station in the area of Milford Road and General Motors Road. A sergeant on duty, along with a department K-9 dog arrived on scene from Commerce Township, and proceeded to conduct a search of the vehicle. According to reports, the K-9 alerted for drugs in several areas but no drugs were located.

The driver was lodged at Oakland County Jail and charged with fleeing and eluding

police, reckless driving and having no operating license on person while driving.

Drunk driving

South Lyon police arrested a 37-year-old Northville man in the early morning hours on Jan. 6 for drunken driving.

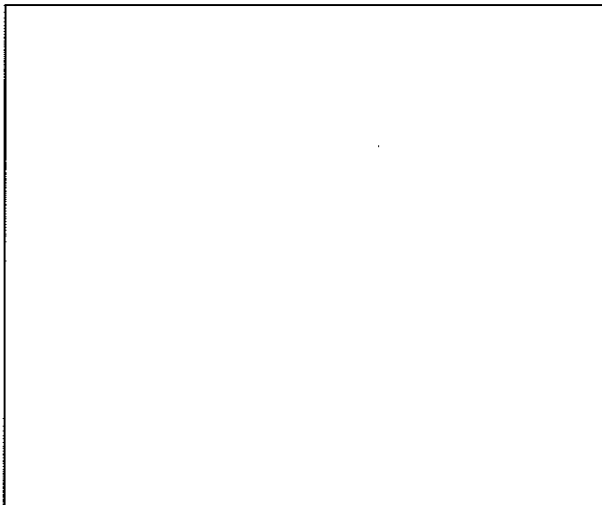
According to reports, an officer on road patrol witnessed the man driving at a high rate of speed in the Pontiac Trail/Nine Mile area around 1:10 a.m. After questioning the man, officers decided to give him a field sobriety test, which he failed. He was arrested and brought back to the police station, where he was given a breath test. He blew a .09 and a .10, both above the legal limit.


The man was jailed until he was sober, and then released. He faces charges of driving while under the influence of alcohol.

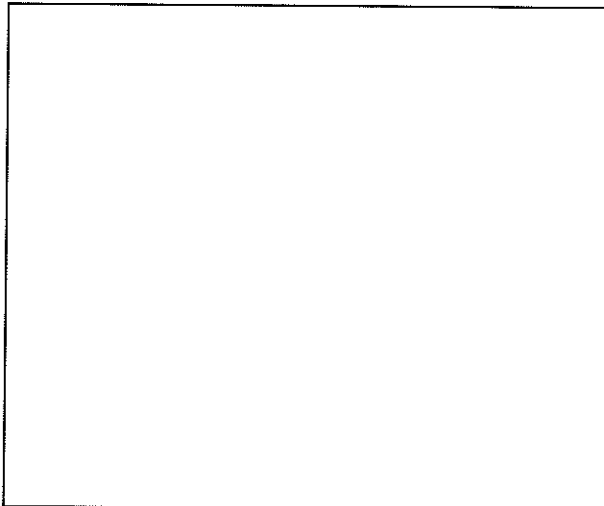
