## Traffic stop leads to arrest of illegal alien

Oakland County Sheriff's Department Highland Substation deputies apprehended an illegal alien on Wednesday, May 19 following a traffic stop.

According to a sheriff's department report, Highland Substation deputies stopped a vehicle on suspicion of operating while under the influence of alcohol at about 4:06 p.m., after receiving calls from concerned residents.

The incident occurred on North Milford Road near Peninsula Lake Road, where deputies found a silver Grand Marquis swerving all over the road. The vehicle was stopped and the driver was given a Breathalyzer test, reportedly resulting in a 0.29 percent blood-alcohol content.

The driver, a 56-year-old male who is believed to be an illegal alien, was transported to POH Regional Medical Center for a blood draw.

According to a sheriff's department report, prior to the blood draw, the man began to resist arrest by attempting to bite a deputy. He also allegedly tried to kick a deputy in the leg. The deputy was not injured and was able to subdue the man.

The man was not able to produce any papers that stated he had a legal right to be in the United States, and he had no Social Security number.

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officials were notified and placed a detainer on the man.

Following his booking, the man allegedly admitted he wasn't a U.S. citizen.
