## Deputies nab two on outstanding warrants

Two lakes area natives were arrested on Wednesday, Nov. 17 after Oakland County Sheriff's Department deputies spent the entire afternoon searching for them in Highland Township.

Jordan Campbell, an 18-year-old Milford Township resident, was wanted on a felony probation warrant. Campbell had been originally charged with forgery-uttering and publishing.

His girlfriend, Sasha Rappuhn, a 20-year-old Highland Township resident, was also wanted on warrants for felony probation violation involving original charges of larceny and forgery-uttering and publishing. Rappuhn also had a criminal bench warrant for contempt of court and failure to comply with a court order on an original charge of assault and battery.

She also had a misdemeanor warrant for shoplifting and retail fraud.

Highland Substation deputies had received word around 3:30 p.m. that Campbell and Rappuhn had recently returned from Ohio and were back in the Highland Greens Mobile Home Park. The officers went to the park to locate either Campbell or his girlfriend.

Upon approaching Campbell's home, he fled on foot and eluded the pursuing deputies in a wooded area on the northwest side of the park.

The Sheriff's Department's Aviation Unit and a Highland Substation K-9 unit were called in to assist in the search. A perimeter was established, but after two hours the air and ground search was terminated.

However, two patrol units remained near the mobile home park entrance because they had received information that Rappuhn was in a white Chevrolet Malibu with another subject, waiting to pick up Campbell.

A deputy observed two males and one female in a white Malibu leaving the park at around 6:50 p.m. It proceeded south on Milford Road before stopping just north of Highland Road. At that time all three subjects were taken into custody.

Both Campbell and Rappuhn were taken to the Oakland County Jail, while the driver, a 24-year-old Lyon Township resident, was released pending further investigation. He could be charged with aiding and abetting the escape.

During the search, Campbell had been hiding in a shed but was unable to flee because of the air and ground search.

"This just shows that you can run but you can not hide from the long arm of the Sheriff's Office," Sheriff Michael Bouchard said in a press release. "My deputies are to be commended for their efforts in keeping the residents of Highland Township safe and trying to be proactive by seeking out and arresting suspects who are wanted on outstanding warrant arrests."

Rappuhn was expected to have a probationary hearing for her charge of assault and battery in 52-1 District Court yesterday, Tuesday, Nov. 23, after press time.
