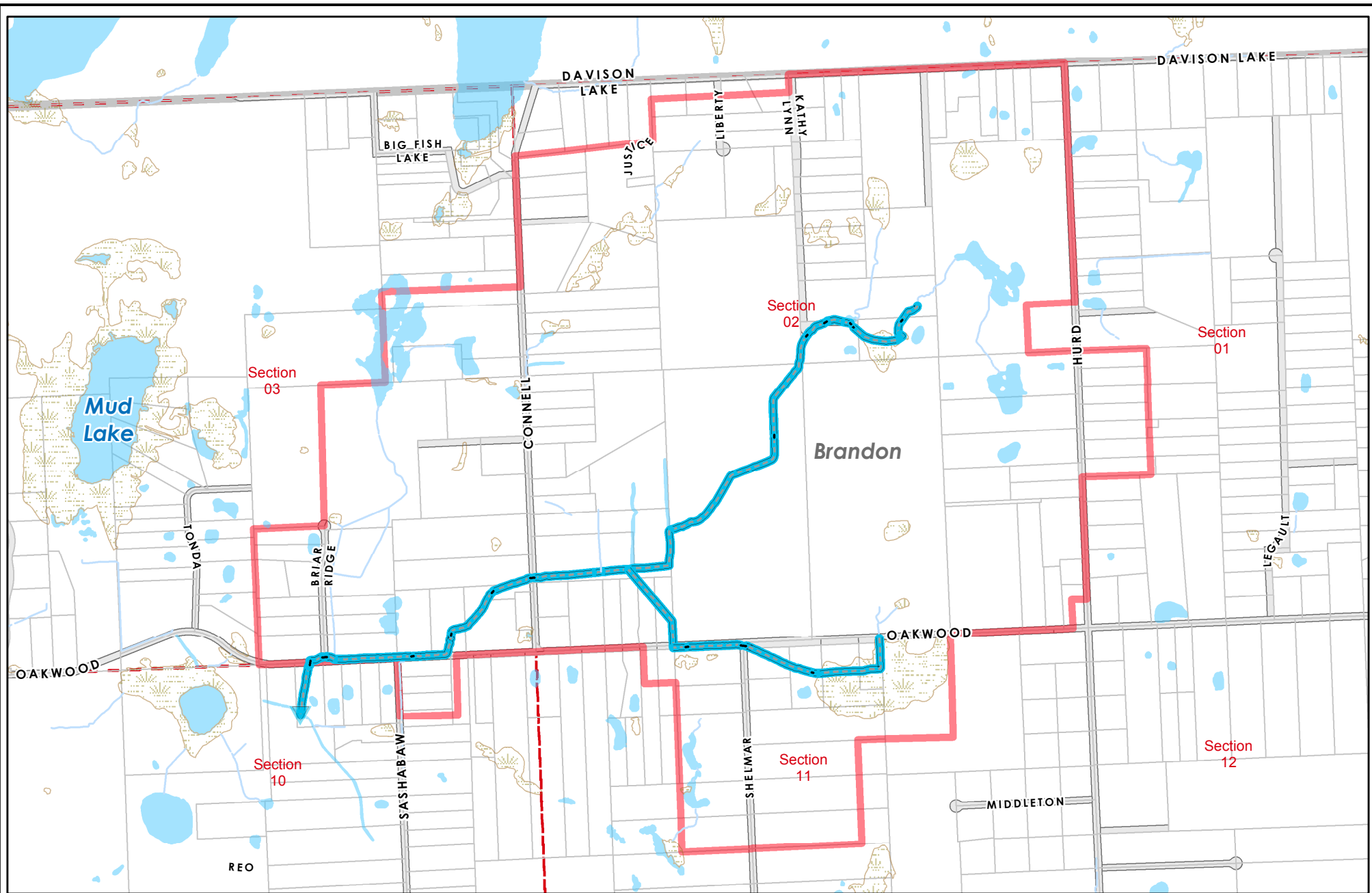


A.J. Taylor County Drain

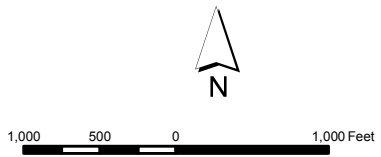
The A.J. Taylor Drain was established in 1903 in accordance with Michigan Drain Law in effect at that time. The drain was established by cleaning out, straightening and widening just over 2 miles of an existing natural watercourse for the public health, convenience and welfare of the people. The cost of the work was \$1,918.89. The A.J. Taylor Drain collects runoff from 867 acres and flows southwesterly into another natural watercourse, which is now known as the Woolman-Wells Drain.
