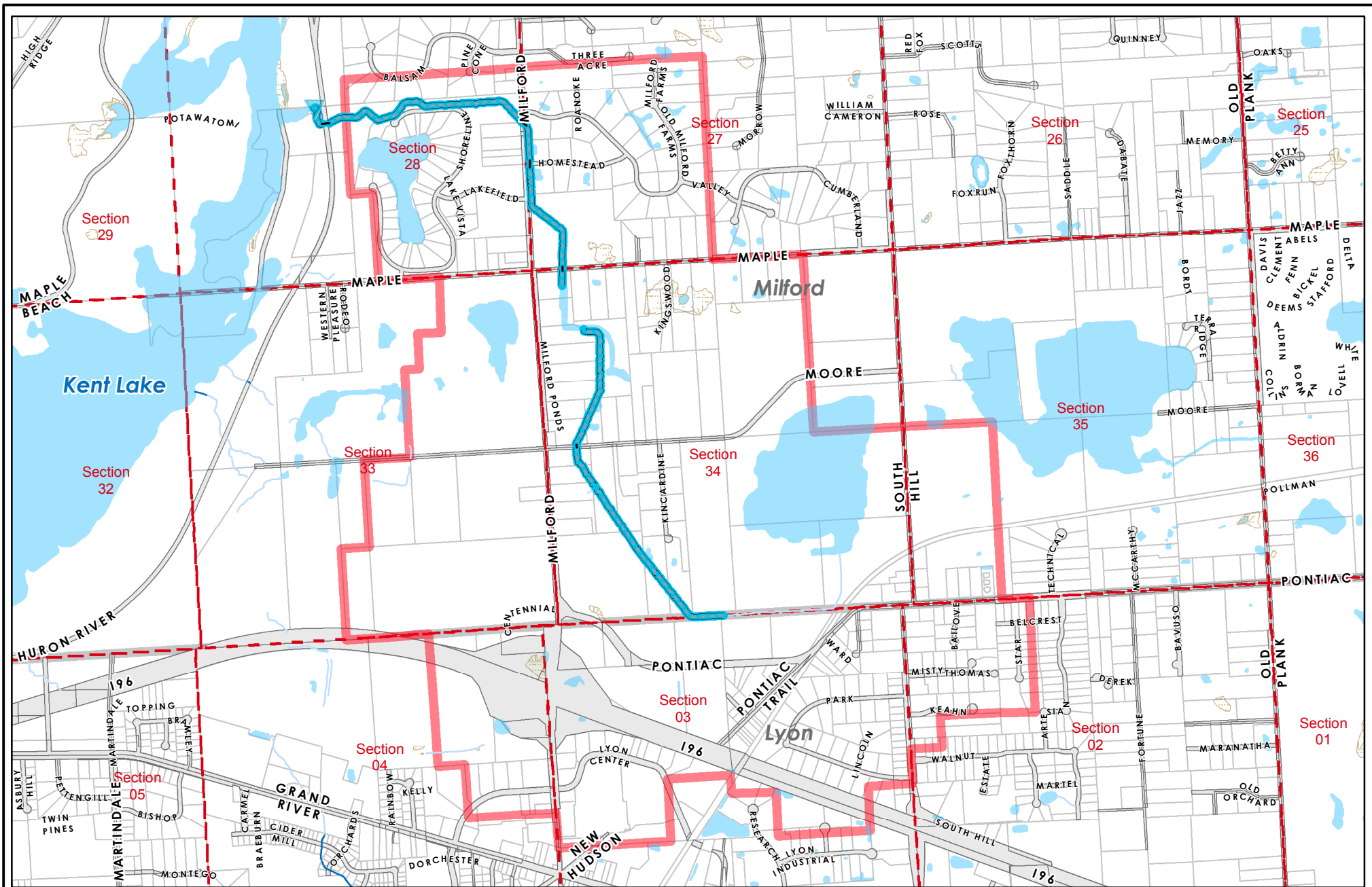


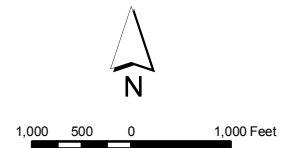
Arthur County Drain

The Arthur Drain was established in 1920 in accordance with Michigan Drain Law in effect at that time. The drain was established by cleaning out and widening just over 2.5 miles of an existing natural watercourse, as well as construction of one bridge and two culverts for the public health, convenience and welfare of the people. The cost of the work was \$7,283. The Arthur Drain collects runoff from 1,841 acres and flows northerly into Kent Lake. A map indicating the drainage district and the location of the drain is available below.
